"I think it's absolutely amazing that Pontefract are making all their fixtures Autism-Friendly. Huge well done to Richard, Norman and the team for making it happen. Autism in Racing and Pontefract Racecourse have built a strong relationship and I'm really looking forward to working with the track for the season ahead." Hosting its first Autism in Racing race days in 2023, Pontefract has made huge steps in improving all aspects of accessibility at the Racecourse and recently carried out a major scheme to upgrade the accessible facilities throughout the site. Their 'Racing for Everyone' race meeting in June 2023 won the coveted 'Raceday Award' at the Racecourse Association Showcase Event in November.

Richard Hammill, Chief Operating Officer for Pontefract Racecourse said:

'Raising awareness of Autism and playing our part in enabling the Racing Industry to be more inclusive is hugely important to us all at Pontefract. The Racecourse has a long association of working with customers and racegoers who have additional needs, as well as with Autism in Racing and to be able to put something in place to make

the Racecourse even more inclusive throughout the season is incredible.' The Racecourse will be working in conjunction with their ticketing provider, Future Ticketing, who will provide valuable funding to enable the initiative to take place every day.

As part of their Autism Friendly race days, the Racecourse will provide designated quiet and safe spaces for autistic Racegoers, or those who may have additional needs, including complimentary soft drinks and biscuits. In addition, there will be a dedicated sensory room, provided by Immersive, at every race meeting. William Buick, champion jockey and Ambassador for Autism in Racing said:

"I congratulate Pontefract for their commitment to Autism Friendly race days. My family has first-hand experience of autism and as an Ambassador for Autism in Racing I welcome the way racecourses are embracing the concept."

<u>Editor's Note</u> – Readers may recall that in issue 378 (just over a year ago) we included details of Bobby Beevers' interview with Brian Goodwill which touched upon this initiative so we are pleased to hear it has continued to thrive in the sport.

HISTORY OF YORK RACES – PART 1

York is one of the premier tracks in Europe having recently won the flat racecourse of the year award – for the fourth year – and also came out on top in the Times newspaper survey of all of Britain's racecourses.

York traces a fascinating history back to Roman and Viking times . Horses raced at York during the days of Emperor Severus during Roman times. York corporation records show that the City first fully supported racing in 1530. In 1607, racing is known to have taken place on the frozen River Ouse between Micklegate Tower and Skeldergate Postern.

The first detailed records of a race meeting date from 1709 when using the course at Clifton Ings. However, this track was affected by flooding and in 1730 racing was moved to the current home of Knavesmire with the first meeting run in 1731. As the name implies it was a mire with a stream running through it and it required a lot of levelling and draining to create the horseshoe shaped course.



The first grandstand was designed and built by architect John Carr in 1754. This was financed by 250 people who each paid 5 guineas and were issued with a brass token bearing their name and an image of the stand – which was the forerunner to the 'County Stand Badge' we know today. The York Racecourse Committee still manages racing at York in the current year having been formed in 1842 to turn around a decline in the quality of racing at the course. By 1846, the committee had introduced the Gimcrack Stakes, which has since become one of York's most enduring races.

If we fast forward 178 years, York's richest race is now the prestigious (Group 1) Juddmonte International which is the highlight of the opening day of the Ebor Festival in August.

The original grandstand was expanded in 1890 (photo above of winners enclosure dated 1912) and then in 1965 a new five tier grandstand was opened. In 1989 the Melrose Stand was opened, quickly followed by the Knavesmire stand. In 2003 the Ebor Stand was opened and is used on race days by annual members.

The courses ever growing status is also recognised by the fact that it also hosted 'Royal Ascot' in 2005 (photo right) and the Ladbrokes St Leger in 2006.

Go Racing In Yorkshire Season Ticket

We've been out and about on course talking to people about the fantastic value season ticket, if you've missed us, here's the lowdown;

<u>Season Ticket Holders</u> gain Grandstand & Paddock admission to **ALL** 182 scheduled fixtures across Yorkshire's nine racecourses, including York's Ebor meeting and St Leger Saturday at Doncaster.

With single and joint (two people living at the same address) options available, it really is the best value ticket in racing and runs from 1st April 2024 - 31st March 2025.

There are 65 weekend and bank holiday fixtures, plus 23 evening fixtures, reciprocals with Yorkshire County Cricket Club and free membership of the Northern and Midlands Racing Club.

Two current season ticket holders informed us that they had paid for their season ticket by St Leger day - which means for the next six months they were racing for free!

If you enjoy your racing, this really is the best way to get around the Yorkshire courses. Upgrades can be made if there is space on the day (there usually is) and it makes it very easy to go racing, just turn up with your ticket, if you're late or need to get away before the last it really doesn't matter.

Yorkshire Beacon Activity

This year we are working with local NHS Trusts and the Bowel Cancer Screening Departments, as they share the message about the benefits of screening.

The bowel cancer screening programme is open to those aged 60 to 74 but the campaign is being extended to include those aged between 50 and 59. It's no surprise that this age group makes up a good number of racegoers and is therefore a great fit.

Look out for the teams as they visit the racecourses each month across the year.

Middleham Open Day

The ever-popular ARC Middleham Open Day returns on Friday 29 March, giving the public the chance to go behind the scenes at some of North Yorkshire's finest horseracing yards.

Tickets for this family friendly event are on sale now, with seven trainers already confirmed to be opening their stables in the morning. Visitors will be able to meet their favourite equine athletes, chat to the trainers and dedicated staff who look after them before enjoying an afternoon of activities on Middleham's Low Moor.

The event is organised by Racing Welfare – the charity which provides a range of support services to people working in or retired from the racing industry, including help with accidents and injuries, mental health, money matters and even housing. It typically attracts up to 3,500 visitors year-on-year and raises vital funds for the charity, which all goes back into supporting the Middleham racing community which is such a big part of the local infrastructure.

Rob and Lindsey Burrow announced on Sunday 28 January 2024 that they were becoming patrons of <u>The</u> <u>Good Racing Company</u>. The Good Racing Company was formed in October 2020 by entrepreneur and racing enthusiast Phil Hawthorne as an innovative way to fundraise for Rob Burrow after the former Leeds Rhinos star announced he was living with MND. To date it has raised over £185,554 for Rob and MND charities through selling memberships to the Rob Burrow Racing Club. At an event for Good Racing Company members at Craig Lidster's racing yard in Easingwold on Sunday, Rob and Lindsey were presented with two giant cheques each for the value of £7,777 in tribute to the number seven shirt Rob wore for Leeds Rhinos.

The Good Racing Company donation was generated through membership sales of The Rob Burrow Racing Club, whilst the second cheque from was from Black Sheep Brewery. Black Sheep, which is a Good Racing Company partner, launched a special <u>Burrow's Blonde</u> beer in 2023 which donated 10 pence from every pint or bottle to the Rob Burrow 7 Discretionary Trust and the Rob Burrow Racing Club. This is the first donation it has made.

Says Rob: "Lindsey and I are thrilled to become patrons of The Good Racing Company. We've spent many an afternoon at the races cheering on our horses alongside some of the people that have bought membership to the racing club. It's great to know we have so much support and are overwhelmed by the money raised over the past three years." The Good Racing Company now has nine racehorses in its stable, and in the coming months each will be assigned a charity cause that they will raise money and awareness for. Rob and Lindsey will be heavily involved in the process of considering causes and specific charities. Rob continues "We're really excited to be involved in the shaping of The Good Racing Company's future. The past few years have shown that there's a lot of support in racing for charity both from the horseracing community itself and from new people discovering the sport for the first time – just like Lindsey and I. The potential to get behind so many different causes is really exciting and we can't wait to get stuck in." Through their involvement in The Good Racing Company, Rob and Lindsey have developed a real passion for horse racing, and attend as many race days as they can. Rob's Grandfather used to love placing a bet on the horses, and it seems Rob has inherited the thrill for the sport. He says: "Nothing beats the thrill of the final furlong!"

The Good Racing Company has celebrated three winners and five places so far in 2024, including Rubellite on January 2nd at Wolverhampton, Basholo on 13th January at Wolverhampton, Alfa Kellenic on 17th January at Newcastle.

In August 2023 Paul Hanagan announced he was becoming The Good Racing Company's first Director of Racing. Paul was a hugely successful dual champion jockey riding over 2,000 winners.

RIPON GETS READY FOR 2024 SEASON BY JONATHAN MULLIN

On the fringe of the tiny, charming city of Ripon, preparations are under way for the upcoming 2024 season at Ripon Racecourse. Despite the harsh winter weather, the course is being carefully primed for the Season Opener on Thursday 18th April. Known as Yorkshire's Garden Racecourse, it is not just the course itself that the team of Groundsmen take great pride in preparing. Through spring and into summer the racecourse is a riot of colour with blooming flowerbeds, jockey silks and trees providing shade from the sun in the Parade Ring and beyond.



Ripon has now been hosting some of the most exciting, prestigious and enjoyable racing in the country for more than 350 years. The first recorded horse races in the Ripon area took place in 1664 on Bondgate Green, a stone's throw away from where the racecourse is now situated. Over the next 236 years, several other venues were used to stage race meetings. Indeed, during one meeting in 1723, Ripon race goers witnessed horse racing history, when they watched the first ever race exclusively for 'lady riders'.

However, none of the historic venues had long lasting success and it took the opening of the current course in 1900 on Boroughbridge Road to establish Ripon's reputation as an important, regular racing venue. The very first meeting at the modern course was held on the sixth of August 1900 and since that time the racecourse has developed much that it is now regarded as the sporting flagship of the picturesque medieval city.

The most valuable race day of the season features the William Hill Great St Wilfrid Handicap and takes place annually in mid-August (Saturday 17th in 2024). With £100,000 in prize money up for grabs and the ITV

cameras in attendance, the big race attracts some of the country's top sprint handicappers and is William Hill's longest standing sports sponsorship!

The Listed EBF Ripon Champion Two-Year-Old *Trophy* on August Bank Holiday Monday sees some of the speediest juveniles do battle over the 6-furlong straight. In 2023 the race was won by the exciting Task Force, who went on to finish runner-up in the Group 1 Juddmonte Middle Park Stakes and looks to have a very exciting three-year-old campaign ahead of him.

From April to September there are a range of fixtures with families, groups and seasoned racegoers in mind. On family days there is plenty of free entertainment and activities for children in the Course Enclosure and most race meetings have musical entertainment on the traditional bandstand, located in the Paddock Enclosure. Ripon Racecourse impresses year on year with its outstanding backdrop, exciting, relaxed atmosphere and location in one of the country's smallest, most beautiful and historic cities.

RACECOURSE ANNUAL MEMBERSHIPS 2024
